A: Your Async class is a subclass of AsyncTask, so calling execute() will start that. You don't need to create another AsyncTask subclass at all for this. You could also set the message on the AsyncTask directly, and have your class extend AsyncTask. // your own constructor and But if you want to call an AsyncTask like that, you need to pass in a reference to your 82157476af
